WELCOME TO SAINT JOHN'S

We are blessed that you have joined us in our worship of Jesus Christ. At Saint John's we worship in the Anglican Tradition; fostering a place where forgiveness, conversion and spiritual renewal can evolve; enabling Christian formation to help us grow that our life may be consecrated to God's work. We pray that you have found us faithful in our witness of His Love and you will make Saint John's your spiritual home.

Receiving Holy Communion

All visitors who have been baptized with water, in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and who have been admitted to Communion in their own church are welcome to share the Holy Eucharist. We are all called to repent of our sins and to approach the Holy Communion as an expression of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. When you come forward to receive the Holy Body and the Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, please approach the Altar Rail in prayer. Cross your right hand over your left that the sacred Host may be laid in the palm of your right hand. When the Chalice is offered, help guide it (if necessary) to your lips. When your communion is complete, pause to give thanks before returning to your seat. If you are not receiving Communion today, you are most welcome to come to the Altar Rail for a blessing; simply cross your arms over your heart.

Ladies wearing lipstick, please remember to blot your lips before coming forward for Communion if you desire to receive directly from the chalice. (If you generally receive by intinction, of course, this is not necessary.) Thank you! — St. John's

If you receive Holy Communion by Intinction

If you make your communion by intinction (which is dipping the Host in Consecrated Wine), our Bishop asks that you retain the Host in the palm of your hand after receiving it, and the priest, deacon or lay minister will touch it to the Wine and place it on your tongue.

A Private Prayer before receiving Holy Communion

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, by the will of the Father and the work of the Holy Spirit Your death brought life to the world. By Your Holy Body and Blood free me from all my sins and from every evil. Keep me faithful to Your teaching, and never let me be parted from You. Amen.

A Private Prayer after receiving Holy Communion

Lord Jesus Christ, may I receive these precious gifts in purity of heart. May Your Body and Blood bring me healing and strength, now and for ever. Amen.

2019 BCP & Advent

Next week begins our season of Advent. With this time of preparation, we will also begin using our 2019 Book of Common Prayer and saying the Psalm responsively by whole verse at the 9:00 and 11:15 services. The principle reason for this is that the ACNA's BCP 2019 (like every BCP from 1549 through the 1928 BCP) uses the Coverdale Psalter, renewed for contemporary use. The 1979 BCP chose a different and more recent translation of the psalms. Currently there are no Anglican Chant settings for the Coverdale Psalter. This will change in time. Pointing the psalms for the choir would be very time consuming, yielding a product that would not be usable for the majority of the congregation. So, for the time being, we will be patient and wait for the ACNA's Liturgy Commission to catch up with all that needs to be done for the 2019 BCP. Let me also say that few people make an effort to read the chant settings currently provided and sing along with the choir. Some sing, but very quietly, so as not to be heard, but most sit and listen. By reading the psalms responsively by whole verse (between lector and people), antiphonally (alternating sides of the congregation), or in unison, all persons will be engaged. This will also teach us to acknowledge the asterisk *, which calls for a reflective pause. So, this is a win-win situation that will help us all better engage God's Word.
