WELCOME TO SAINT JOHN'S

We are blessed that you have joined us in our worship of Jesus Christ. At Saint John's we worship in the Anglican Tradition; fostering a place where forgiveness, conversion and spiritual renewal can evolve; enabling Christian formation to help us grow that our life may be consecrated to God's work. We pray that you have found us faithful in our witness of His Love and you will make Saint John's your spiritual home.

Receiving Holy Communion

All visitors who have been baptized with water, in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and who have been admitted to Communion in their own church are welcome to share the Holy Eucharist. We are all called to repent of our sins and to approach the Holy Communion as an expression of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. When you come forward to receive the Holy Body and the Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, please approach the Altar Rail in prayer. Cross your right hand over your left that the sacred Host may be laid in the palm of your right hand. When the Chalice is offered, help guide it (if necessary) to your lips. When your communion is complete, pause to give thanks before returning to your seat. If you are not receiving Communion today, you are most welcome to come to the Altar Rail for a blessing; simply cross your arms over your heart.

Ladies wearing lipstick, please remember to blot your lips before coming forward for Communion if you desire to receive directly from the chalice. (If you generally receive by intinction, of course, this is not necessary.) Thank you!

If you receive Holy Communion by Intinction

If you make your communion by intinction (which is dipping the Host in Consecrated Wine), our Bishop asks that you retain the Host in the palm of your hand after receiving it and the priest, deacon or lay minister will touch it to the Wine and place it on your tongue.

Lent at St John's.

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, Feb 26th. The Prayer Book explains that Lent is a forty-day season for penitence, fasting and prayer, in preparation for the Great Feast of the Resurrection.

In the early Church if someone wished to become a Christian he was given instruction in the doctrines and practices of the Church. He also had to show by his conduct that he was earnest in his desire *to live* the Christian Way. This period of instruction and discernment took several years. Lent emerged as the final days of this instruction and discernment period. So, forty days were carved out to reflect the forty days our Lord fasted and prayed in the wilderness as preparation for His ministry. In early Christianity the only time baptism was celebrated was at the Great Easter Vigil and on Easter morning.

For Christians today, Lent remains a time of spiritual and intellectual renewal and growth. We want to renew our discipleship and increase our knowledge and love of our faith.

✠ The ashes on Ash Wednesday symbolize our mortality and our sorrow for our sins. By tracing the sign of the Cross upon our forehead with ashes we are reminded how we were signed with the Cross in baptism using chrism to make us Christ's own forever. The ashes are to inspire us during these 40 days, so that by hearing God's Word and responding to His call to repent and believe, we may enter fully into the joyful celebration of His Resurrection of Easter Morning.

- ✠ The "Alleluia's" and the *Gloria in excelsis* are omitted in Lent.
- ✠ No flowers are on the Altar.
- ✠ The liturgical color is purple.
- ✠ The Great Litany is sung in Procession on the First Sunday in Lent.

Lenten Program

What if you could ask C. S. Lewis his thoughts on some of the most difficult questions of life?

Alister McGrath, Ph.D is a theologian, scientist, and Anglican priest in the Church of England. He currently holds the Andreas Idreos Professorship in Science and Religion in the Faculty of Theology and Religion at the University of Oxford, and is Professor of Divinity at Gresham College.

During Lent this year McGrath and Lewis will be our insightful guides to lead us deeper into knowing, loving, and celebrating our faith!
