WELCOME TO SAINT JOHN'S

We are blessed that you have joined us in our worship of Jesus Christ. At Saint John's we worship in the Anglican Tradition; fostering a place where forgiveness, conversion and spiritual renewal can evolve; enabling Christian formation to help us grow that our life may be consecrated to God's work. We pray that you have found us faithful in our witness of His Love and you will make Saint John's your spiritual home.

Receiving Holy Communion

All visitors who have been baptized with water, in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and who have been admitted to Communion in their own church are welcome to share the Holy Eucharist. We are all called to repent of our sins and to approach the Holy Communion as an expression of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. When you come forward to receive the Holy Body and the Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, please approach the Altar Rail in prayer. Cross your right hand over your left that the sacred Host may be laid in the palm of your right hand. When the Chalice is offered, help guide it (if necessary) to your lips. When your communion is complete, pause to give thanks before returning to your seat. If you are not receiving Communion today, you are most welcome to come to the Altar Rail for a blessing; simply cross your arms over your heart.

Ladies wearing lipstick, please remember to blot your lips before coming forward for Communion if you desire to receive directly from the chalice. (If you generally receive by intinction, of course, this is not necessary.) Thank you!

If you receive Holy Communion by Intinction

If you make your communion by intinction (which is dipping the Host in Consecrated Wine), our Bishop asks that you retain the Host in the palm of your hand after receiving it and the priest, deacon or lay minister will touch it to the Wine and place it on your tongue.

Flu Season is upon us.

In this "flu season" a lot of attention has been given to the coronavirus. You can look on the CDC website <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-nCoV/summary.html> for more information.

When it comes to protecting ourselves and others from any strain of virus we should practice good hygiene and common sense. I'm speaking about the basics like covering your cough and *washing your hands often with regular soap and running water* to help stop the spread of germs and respiratory illnesses like the flu and COVID-19. Stay at home when you or your child is sick. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.

If regular soap and running water are not available, using a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol can help. *But, sanitizers do not get rid of all types of germs.* Also, there is growing evidence that *excessive use* of antibacterial soaps and hand sanitizers remove too much good bacteria from our hands and body. This leaves our skin exposed to many problems. But the occasional use of sanitizers can be helpful.

Passing the Peace. During the flu season we might want to avoid direct contact, such as hugs and hand shakes at the passing of the Peace of Christ.

Intinction. When receiving the Precious Blood of Christ you may do this by *intinction* instead of drinking from the Chalice. This is allowing the CHALICE BEARER to take the consecrated host from the palm of your hand and dip the host partially in the Precious Blood and then place the host on your tongue.

The consecrated host only. During flu season you may receive Holy Communion by receiving the consecrated host *only*. Our norm is to make our Communion using both the Precious Blood and the consecrated Bread (host) because our Lord administered both to the apostles on Maundy Thursday and commanded us to do the same. But, each Eucharistic element, the consecrated Wine or the consecrated Bread contain the full divinity of Jesus. So, whether you receive just the host (or the Precious Blood) you make your full communion with God.

If you wish to abstain from the Chalice here's what you do. After receiving the host and consuming it, *please remain kneeling* and when the Chalice Bearer comes to you, please cross your arms across your chest to indicate for the Chalice Bearer to pass by. After the "flu season" you can go back to receiving both kinds.
