ACNA Book of Common Prayer 2019.

The call for a new Book of Common Prayer was made in 2009, at the time of the formation of the Anglican Church in North America. A Liturgy and Common Worship Task Force was appointed. The guiding principle has been the 1662 Book of Common Prayer in addition to other historic Prayer Books like the 1928 BCP. The proposed liturgies are available for review and download on ACNA's website: www.anglicanchurch.net.

The College of Bishops meeting in January 2019 will set in motion the publication of the Prayer Book.

There are many nice features to the Book of Common Prayer 2019. An example is the restoration of the full text of a much beloved prayer, what is called "The Prayer of Humble Access." It is a faithful rendering of the historic prayer, what you find in the

1928 BCP. The 1979 BCP deleted the parallelism of our body and soul needing to be cleansed by the Body and Blood of Christ as found in the 1662 BCP. The 2019 BCP text has restored this.

The Prayer of Humble Access BCP 2019

Celebrant and People together say

"We do not presume to come to this your table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in your abundant and great mercies.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table; but you are the same Lord, whose character is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, *that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us.* Amen."

The present 1979 BCP wording

"We do not presume to come to this thy Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy Table. But thou art the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen. "

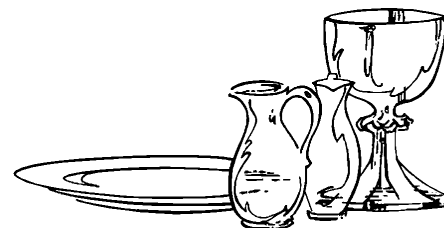
